COVID-19 Cases Update

As of this morning, there are 7 active cases of COVID-19 in the region. Low case numbers mean that what we are doing is working. To keep numbers low, we must practise all prevention measures including getting fully vaccinated. More information about case numbers can be found on our website.

COVID-19 Vaccine Update

To date, NWHU and our partners have provided over 75,000 doses of the COVID-19 vaccine in our region. Currently, 71% of our population aged 18+ have had at least 1 dose and 35% have had 2 doses of the vaccine.

Anyone aged 18+ who had a first dose of the Pfizer or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine at least 28 days ago is now eligible for their second dose.

The public is urged to book an appointment for their COVID-19 vaccine. First or second doses can be booked online using the [NWHU Booking Site \(https://clinicreservation.com/book-now\)](https://clinicreservation.com/book-now) or by calling 1-866-468-2240. Although NWHU has been offering some walk-in spots when clinics are not fully booked, it is recommended that you book an appointment to ensure your spot and to avoid waiting in a long line-up on vaccination day. Walk-in spots will be limited as appointment spaces book up.

Eligible groups to get the vaccine include:

Dose 1: -Anyone aged 12 years or older

Dose 2: -Anyone aged 18+ who had their first dose of an mRNA vaccine at least 28 days ago
-Anyone who had AstraZeneca as a first dose at least 56 days (8 weeks) ago

Anyone with a previously booked second dose appointment that was scheduled at the time of booking their first dose should book an earlier appointment or attend a walk-in clinic.
