	Title	Strengthening Public Health Feasibility Assessment

PURPOSE

To provide context to a Board of Health decision to begin engaging in exploratory discussions and feasibility assessment of a merger between Northwestern Health Unit and Thunder Bay District Health Unit (TBDHU).

BACKGROUND

On August 22, 2023, the Ministry of Health <u>announced</u> its intent to work with partners on a strategy to strengthen public health. This announcement also indicated that there will be one-time funding, resources, and supports available for local public health agencies that voluntarily merge.

The Ministry's strategy is centred on three priorities:

- 1. Clarifying roles and responsibilities through the Ontario Public Health Standards (OPHS).
- 2. Supporting voluntary mergers among Local Public Health Agencies (LPHAs).
- 3. Providing stable, sustainable funding to LPHAs.

And indicates that voluntary mergers, as one of the components of the strategy, particularly among smaller LPHAs, have potential to address long-standing challenges in the public health system and present an opportunity to work towards a vision for an optimized and better coordinated public health system.

The timeline associated with funding to support voluntary mergers would require a request for in-year funding to be submitted prior to year-end, with a merger proposal, should that be the direction taken by local public health agencies, to be submitted with the Annual Service Plan (ASP) in March 2024 for implementation by January 1, 2025.

BUDGET

In-year requests for one-time funding to support feasibility assessments will be accepted for those local public health agencies who are unable to manage the cost through their existing funding/budget.

DISCUSSION & RISK ANALYSIS

- Given the vast geographic area covered by Northwestern Health Unit, and that covered by Thunder Bay District Health Unit, in addition to the number of rural and remote communities within each health unit's catchment area, it is unclear how a merger would impact public health service delivery for residents in each municipality, unorganized territories, and to urban and on-community Indigenous populations.

- The approach laid out by the Ministry does include language recognizing that mergers of geographically large, remote, and sparsely populated LPHAs may result in geographic challenges that outweigh the benefits of achieving a minimum population base of 500,000. In order to determine the feasibility of a merger for Northwestern Health Unit and Thunder Bay District Health Unit and to determine if such a merger would, in fact, meet Ministry of Health objectives and desired outcomes, a feasibility assessment would need to be completed, and would best be completed jointly with Northwestern Health Unit and Thunder Bay District Health Unit.
